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Flocks & Feathers Community Day at the Everhart Museum Sunday, March 30, 2008, 1:00 to 4:00 p.m.

Scranton, **February 15**, **2008**: Join the Everhart Museum on Sunday, March 30, 2008 from 1:00 to 4:00 p.m. for *Community Day* as we celebrate birds! The day's activities highlight birds and serve as a complement to the Museum's permanent and temporary bird exhibits. The Museum began its centennial year in February with avian-oriented exhibits in order to showcase more than 2,000 ornithological specimens which were the foundation of its permanent collection, donated in 1908 by museum founder Dr. Isaiah Fawkes Everhart.

Community Day promises to offer something for everyone and is of interest to all ages. Local artists will guide family-oriented activities such as fly-tying, weaving and pysanky (Ukrainian Easter Egg) demonstrations. Guided tours of our current exhibition "Flocks & Feathers: Birds in Science, Culture and Art," which features artists and objects from around the world, will be given throughout the afternoon. All activities are free with paid admission to the museum and no reservation is required.

For jewelry enthusiasts, a one-of-a-kind presentation on Chinese Kingfisher Feather Jewelry will be given at 3:00 p.m. by renowned jewelry expert, Elyse Karlin. Ms. Karlin is the founder, publisher and editor-in-chief of "Adornment: The Magazine of Jewelry and Related Arts." She is the past president of The American Society of Jewelry Historians and the author of the definitive book on jewelry of the Arts and Crafts Movement, "Jewelry and Metalwork in the Arts and Crafts Tradition," as well as seven other books. Ms. Karlin's talk will provide a fascinating glimpse into the history of the Chinese culture's use of the electric blue feathers of the kingfisher bird to enhance decorative ornaments and objects. No reservations are required and admission is free with paid admission to the museum.
