Fiesta at the Everhart on October 1, 2009!

Scranton – September 8, 2009: The Everhart Museum invites you and your friends to join us on Thursday, October 1, 2009 beginning at 6:00 pm for "Fiesta at the Everhart Museum," a benefit preview featuring the Museum's new exhibitions Day of the Dead: Art & Culture in the Americas and Celebrating Ancestors: Student Art at the Everhart.

Day of the Dead: Art & Culture in the Americas is a family-oriented exhibit focused on the celebration and remembrance of family and friends, a universal theme found in all cultures. While Mexico is perhaps best-known for their Day of the Dead celebration, many other Latin American and Caribbean countries honor their ancestors on this holiday, including Brazil, Guatemala, Haiti, Martinique, and Peru. The Day of the Dead occurs on November 1st and 2nd in connection with the Roman Catholic observances of All Saints' Day and All Souls' Day. It is believed that during this time it is easier for the souls of the departed to contact the living; therefore, the celebration is one of joy, meant to encourage visits by the souls. Day of the Dead: Art & Culture in the Americas will feature contemporary art from nationally and internationally recognized artists, folk art, documentary photography, video installation, objects from the Everhart Museum's Pre-Columbian collection, and other objects reflecting Mexican and other Latino cultures' celebratory expression of *El Día de los Muertos*. Day of the Dead: Art & Culture in the Americas is exclusive to the Everhart and will be on display through December 31, 2009. The exhibition is funded in part by a grant from The Pennsylvania Humanities Council, with additional underwriting from the Foley Law Firm, Gertrude Hawk Chocolates, Inc. and Prudential Retirement.

Celebrating Ancestors: Student Art at the Everhart complements the Day of the Dead exhibit and showcases the work of area students who were invited to create artworks inspired by important people in their lives who have passed away, such as a parent, grandparent, friend or relative; several students also decided to focus on famous and notable public figures.
