The afternoon activities highlight the fascinating world of tools, construction, design, and the mechanics of how things work. The event complements the Museum's newest exhibit, *Tools in Motion: Work from the Hechinger Collection*, which showcases repetition and motion in common, everyday tools and hardware.

Tools in Motion Community Day promotes educational discovery for visitors of all ages. Math, science, engineering, and manufacturing will be brought to life through exhibit tours, hands-on activities, demonstrations and much more. Join the Museum's curator at 2:00 pm for a guided tour of the *Tools in Motion* exhibit to learn about the amazing art and sculpture inspired by and created with tools. Then make your own tool-inspired artwork and experiments under the guidance of museum educators and volunteers.
