## Cultural Wine-Tasting Event at the Everhart

**Scranton – March 14, 2008:** Join the Everhart Museum on April 10, 2008 from 6 pm to 8 pm for *Wine on the Wing*, an evening of wine, food and cultural entertainment designed to complement the Museum's current exhibition *Flocks & Feathers: Birds in Science, Culture and Art*. *Flocks & Feathers* showcases the museum's ornithological specimens – a core collection of over 2,000 examples donated in 1908 by the museum's founder, Dr. Isaiah Fawkes Everhart – as well as artifacts from its ethnographic and art collections incorporating feathers and/or depicting birds. The exhibit narrative of *Flocks & Feathers* is designed to flow in complement to global migratory patterns so that visitors will travel the world learning about the importance and role of birds in specific cultures as they move through each gallery. In addition to exploring the museum's permanent collections, *Flocks & Feathers* presents interpretative issues such as evolution/extinction, hunting/conservation, health concerns, and a myriad of other ideas.

Expanding upon issues such as migration and conservation, *Wine on the Wing: A Wine-Tasting Cultural Event* will feature samplings of wines identified with viniculture in specific international regions. The event will feature great American wines, as well as unique wines from Europe, Africa, and Australia. Attendees will migrate from California to Argentina, France to Africa, and even Asia to learn about the history of the wine and the grape from each region. Discover the connections between wine, science, and culture, including the environmental impact of winemaking, how vineyard development effects habitats and migratory birds, and the history of wine and birds in literature and music.

Space is limited to 125 participants (age 21 and older), so the early bird catches the wine! Cost is \$35 for members, \$40 for non-members, or become an Event Patron for \$100. Event Patrons will receive acknowledgement on signage and program flyer and a preview tour of *Flocks & Feathers* with the curator at 5:30 pm.
