Engage with OurSELF:

The Everhart Museum's Thoughtfully Interactive Exhibit Fostering Open-Dialogue Surrounding Mental Health

Scranton, PA ----Do you enjoy challenging your perspective in order to expand your mind? Now through April 29, 2019, guests visiting the Everhart Museum have the chance to go on a journey through a sequence of experiences that represent the human condition during the span of an hour, a day, a year, or a lifetime. Newly opened, **OurSELF: A Reflection of Us** is an interactive art exhibition created by Scranton's The Pop Up Studio that focuses on the topic of mental health. Through this art installation, the Everhart and The Pop Up Studio hope to advance a much-needed and long-overdue conversation about mental health. While moving through the galleries, visitors are encouraged to question their understanding of their environment and their ability to control it amidst emotional and sensory encounters.

HerSELF: Through the eyes of Amy Kiser serves as an inspiration and conceptual launching point for the OurSELF exhibition. Artist Amy Kiser provides insight into HerSELF by vulnerably exposing powerful and traumatic incidents she had endured. Through color washes and scratchy line work, Kiser created layers that represent those that are ever-developing inside all of us. Utilizing paint and lithographic prints, her work is haunting and relatable.
