Position Overview: School and educator programs use works in the Everhart's collection to create a space for students to learn, engage, and exchange ideas. We encourage educators to visit the museum prepared for students to have both open and guided discussion, and to continue the conversation in the classroom. This internship provides an excellent opportunity for students to learn about museum education in a small, dynamic department.

The Museum Education Intern will assist all aspects of the department, but will be primarily focused on K-12th grade programming and curriculum related to an ongoing 3D printing project.

Responsibilities:

- Research on trends in digital rendering of museum objects.
- Creation of a comprehensive body of research on our 3D digital scans of collection objects. We will work together to choose specific objects for this project.
- Creation of digital content relating to museum education and object based learning.
- Preparation of accessible materials, including large print guides.
- Learning and understanding how to facilitate an inquiry based discussion.
- Assist with the development of gallery curriculum with a specific focus on object-based learning.

Qualifications:

The intern should be a junior or senior in college, or a graduate student. Interest in K-12 Museum Education is recommended, as is a desire to learn about multimodal and object-based learning. We would also love to work with students studying graphic design or 3D printing. The intern should have an interest in education, art, history, and/or museum studies. The ideal candidate will be organized, collaborative, friendly, flexible, and passionate.
