LINE

Lines and curves are marks that span a distance between two points. Here are some examples of line:

Straight 

Curve 

Wavy 

Zig Zag 

Thin vs Thick 

Spiral 

Scribble

COLOR

Color is the element of art that is produced when light, striking an object, is reflected back to the eye.

Look around. What colors do you see? Using crayons, draw swatches of color you see around you and describe what you are looking at on the lines below.

TEXTURE

Texture is used to describe the way a three-dimensional work actually feels when touched. In two-dimensional work, such as painting, it may refer to the visual "feel" of a piece.

In the space above, describe the textures you see around you in nature.

If possible, create a rubbing by placing a 3-dimensional object under your paper and rub the crayon onto the paper to pick up a texture.
