Position Overview: The Research & Interpretation Intern will begin to conduct research on the Everhart's Natural History collection, as part of an upcoming renovation of the Everhart's Natural History wing. This internship will focus on researching natural history specimen as well as their connection to cultural and fine art. The commitment is from June 21, 2021 to August 14, 2021 as part of the Summer 2021 Museum Practice Program. **This internship opportunity is only available for currently students enrolled at Fordham University.**

Responsibilities:

- Conduct preliminary research on natural history specimen in the Museum's collection
- Use the interpretation framework to complete research on 2-5 specimen in the museum collection
- Create a comprehensive body of research, choosing interpretation themes that appeal to different audiences
- Assist in archiving research into Museum database
