
2022 Scholastic Art & Writing Awards Announcement and *Gold Key Exhibition,* on View February 3–27

The *Gold Key Exhibition* at the Everhart will showcase works by all Gold Key Award recipients from February 3 through February 27, 2022.






Meaningful Objects on View February 3–June 5
