Bold Independence: African American Quilts from the Collection of David Whaley, which is also on view through June 5, features quilts made during the second half of the 20th century by eleven African American women from Mississippi and Alabama. A number of the works are by the famous Gee's Bend quilters and a majority were produced in the Black Belt region of Central Alabama.

Meet Everhart Museum Supporter Alyssa Loney



Alyssa Loney, a reference librarian at the Scranton Public Library, says her love of the Everhart began when she would come on school field trips. "The most memorable one was with a summer art group I attended when I was about 10 years old. We were in the bird gallery, and I decided to draw the snowy owl. It was one of the only times that I ever successfully created art that looked like what I was attempting to capture." To this day, she values the Museum as one of the hidden gems of the city, saying It was one of the first places that she visited once everything started opening again during the pandemic.

Working for a nonprofit cultural institution herself, Alyssa knows the need for supporting such institutions. During times of economic turmoil, these institutions are among the first to see funding cuts, she says. "I just want to do my part in supporting organizations that I enjoy so they will continue to be around in the future...They provide an opportunity to reflect on yourself as part of the larger picture of both a community and in world history...The Everhart Museum allows people in the Scranton area and beyond to experience objects, such as dinosaur fossils and exotic birds, that we wouldn't see otherwise."

As for what specifically draws her interest at the Museum, she has recently developed an affinity for the glassworks in the Museum's Dorflinger collection. "It is amazing the amount of detail people can achieve with a medium that seems so difficult to work with due to the high temperatures and fragile nature of the finished product."
