Rocks and Minerals Gallery Reopening Saturday, August 6

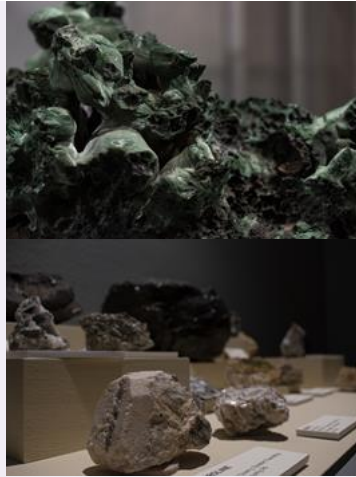
The Everhart's ever-popular Rocks and Minerals Gallery is reopening Saturday, August 6 following extensive renovations and a reimagining of the space. Opening day coincides with the Museum's free admission day from 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. in celebration of the Electric City Flower Show at Nay Aug Park.

The gallery features a fluorescent rocks and minerals case; a variety of regionally-collected rocks and minerals; educational exhibits highlighting rock and mineral properties and origins; and a showcase of exceptional specimens collected both locally and from around the world.

The longterm project also included extensive restoration

and care for the Museum's geological collections.

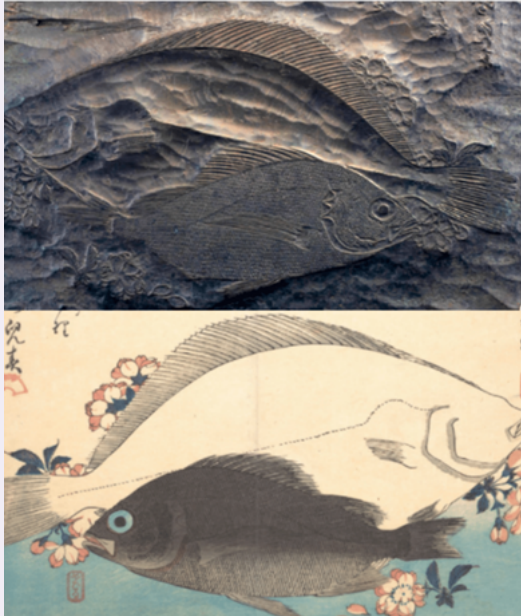
