**In Full Bloom: Free Admission Day Takes Place
at Everhart Museum Saturday, August 6**

Scranton, PA - On Saturday, August 6, the Everhart Museum presents In Full Bloom: Free Admission Day, which includes free admission during the Museum's regular hours of 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. as well as free guided tours of the Museum's galleries and floral-inspired crafts from 1:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m.

The event celebrates the opening of the Museum's new floral-themed art exhibition *In Full Bloom: Flowers of the Everhart* and coincides with the Electric City Flower Show, which takes place from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. in Nay Aug Park.

The exhibition, on view through December 31, 2022, showcases the essence of flowers as captured in painting, drawing, 3D art, and photography. It pulls from the Museum's rich collections to celebrate flowers' ephemeral beauty and the efforts to preserve it through diverse artistic methods and styles across cultures and time. Artists featured in this exhibition include Jon Carsman, Evelyn Metzger, Margaret Oettinger, and more.
