Dorflinger Glass Gallery Reinstallation Now Open on Long-Term View



The Everhart's permanent **Dorflinger Glass Gallery** has reopened following an extensive reinstallation, completed with assistance from <u>Dorflinger Factory</u> <u>Museum</u> President, CEO, and Founder Jim Asselstine and Curator Kurt Reed. A fixture of the Museum since 1969, this Gallery features glass created by the worldrenowned Dorflinger glassmaking companies from 1852 through 1921. Dorflinger Glass operated in White Mills, PA for many of these years.

This new installation traces the chronology of Dorflinger Glass as represented in the Everhart's collection and features remarkable pieces from the Abraham Lincoln and Benjamin Harrison White Houses, as well as renowned glass colored by Honesdale Decorating Company in Honesdale, PA from 1901 to 1915.
