

City Nature Challenge: iNaturalist Workshop Saturday, April 21

The Everhart Museum welcomes nature enthusiasts throughout NEPA for a free information session and workshop on the <u>City Nature Challenge</u> (CNC) on April 21 from 1:00 to 3:00 p.m.! Conducted by local naturalist and regional coordinator Matt Schultz, this event delves into the CNC, a four day global event from April 26 to April 29 in which citizen scientists document the biodiversity of their communities.

Participants will learn how to use the iNaturalist platform to make nature observations in Nay Aug Park. iNaturalist is a free smartphone app/website used to document and share nature observations.

The CNC is organized by the Natural History Museum of LA County and California Academy of Sciences.
