Bruce Checefsky is a photographer and artist from Peckville, PA whose art involves utilizing a scanner to create distorted photographs. A unique take on natural beauty, this exhibition invites visitors to view flowers and plants in a new way.

While scanners are typically intended to reproduce images in an exact manner, Cheshefsky's technique of recording images from afar via scanner produces results reminiscent of science-fiction landscapes. His productions are random, unique, and singular, and even he never knows quite what will be produced. In celebration of the reopening of Nay Aug Park's <u>Brooks Mine</u> in 2023, *Northeastern Pennsylvania Coalfields* showcases the rich coal heritage of the region through art; coal mining tools and wares; and geological objects. The complicated relationship between the industry and the communities and areas that were impacted is explored.
