

231 Gates, The Matrix of Creation

"Twenty-two foundation letters: He placed them in a circle like a wall with 231 Gates. The Circle oscillates back and forth... He permuted them, weighed them, and transformed them, Alef with them all and all of them with Alef, Bet with them all and all of them with Bet. They repeat in a cycle and exist in 231 Gates. It comes out that all that is formed and all that is spoken emanates from one Name..."

- *Sefer Yetzira (One of the first Kabbalistic texts ever written, said to be composed by Abraham our Forefather, or Adam)*

A Circle of Letters:

Visualize the 22 letters of the Alef Beis (Hebrew Alpha Bet) arrayed in a circle with lines branching out from each letter. These lines connect every individual letter in the array to every other letter, creating a pattern of 231 lines, or "Gates". Each letter is considered a vessel through which divine energy flows, and together they form a complete system encompassing all aspects of existence.

Creation Through Speech:

According to Judaism, the universe and everything in it is brought into being by the utterances of HaShem (G-d). The Hebrew letters are not merely symbols but have inherent creative power. By combining letters in specific sequences to form words, the divine essence manifests within the material world, bringing forth existence from nothingness. The "231 Gates" embody the profound significance of the Hebrew language and alphabet as tools of creation and divine interaction. G-d created the world through speech, and speech is comprised of the combinations of these letters. The geometry of this piece displays the matrix of possibilities formed by the combinations of the Hebrew characters and is the foundation through which this finite world was created.

Kabbalah & Numerology:

Through studying the words and letters themselves, there are many different ways to decode messages hidden within the Torah. A hint at the possibilities of this is written in the quote above; "He permuted them, weighed them, and transformed them."

Permutation shifts the letters of a word, drawing down additional meaning and insight. For example, the name "ישראל", "Israel", could be "ישר א-ל" which means "Straight to G-d" or it could even hint at the 231 Gates, when we rearrange its letters: "יש רל"א, "There are 231" (the numerical value of "רל"א).

Weighing refers to calculating Gematriot (numerical values of letters and words). This is commonly used to find connections between concepts and can be found hidden in passages throughout the Torah and esoteric works.

Transformation comes from exchanging letters with one another through different codes. Used properly, the 231 Gates can be a cipher for these mysteries. For example, one can exchange the first and last letters of the Aleph-Bet with one another. This is called the At-Bash (א"ת - ב"ש) system and can be found by locating the 11 horizontal lines within the piece. Another cipher is

the AI-Bom (א"ל - ב"מ) system, which can be found by locating the letters directly across from one another through the central point. By using these methods one can discover deeper meanings hidden behind the ancient text.

These few examples only scratch the surface of the depth within this piece, leaving much more to expound upon and discover over time.

Meditation and Contemplation:

It is written in the Sefer Yetzira: "Engrave them [the letters] as a garden around you, carve them like a wall surrounding you, and deck them like a ceiling above your head." This meditation first awakened within me a deep connection to this concept and I was inspired to create this piece. It signifies enveloping oneself in the divine presence and understanding the fundamental role of language and speech in the process of creation and illumination into one's inner self and the universe as a whole.

In essence, the concept of the 231 Gates encapsulates the profound idea that the universe is structured and sustained through the interactions of divine language (the Hebrew alphabet). Each gate represents a unique aspect of creation, and through understanding and meditating upon this concept, individuals seek to deepen their connection to the divine and gain insights into the nature of reality and existence itself.

The Hebrew letters symbolize not only linguistic combinations but also the underlying spiritual and cosmic laws that govern existence. Formulated by stringing together the individual letters into a unified web, the 231 Gates is the secret where the foundation of the universe lies. The study and contemplation of these gates allow the viewer to delve deeper into these mysteries and unlock the profound details and depth hidden within the piece.
