The Everhart is proud to become a part of the <u>Museums</u> for All program!



paintings.

Much of his work examines the concepts of death and religion, as he seeks to pose questions but not answer them.

To coincide with the dates of the original Woodstock Music Festival in 1969, *Peace, Love, and Music* looks at the art representing the musical voices and culture of the era.

Through concert posters, ephemera, photography, and artifacts from the 1960s and beyond, this special retrospective takes visitors on a trip back to a groovy time in American history.


