Admission includes an OPEN BAR from 5:30 to 7:00 p.m. and a cash bar from 7:00 to 8:30 p.m.

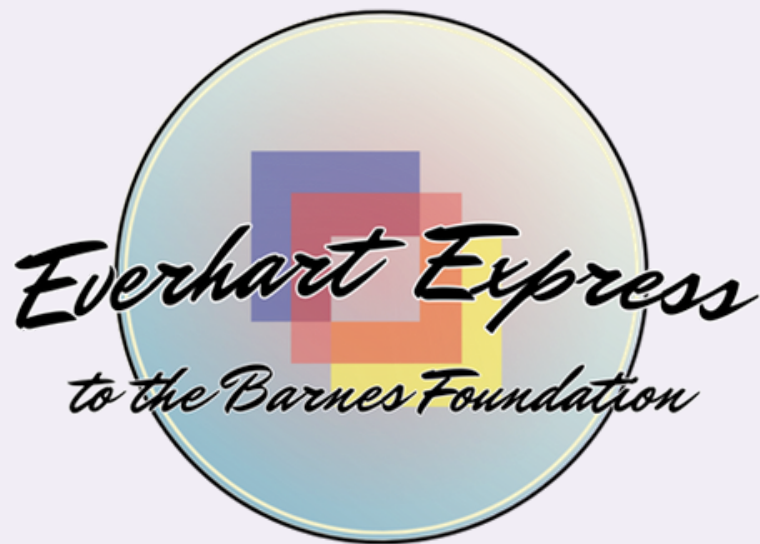

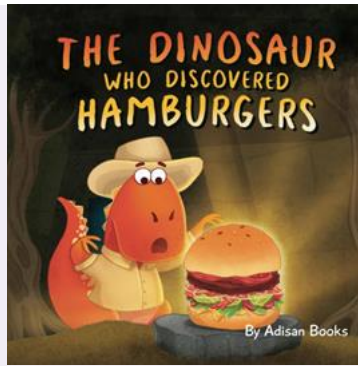
