


# **EXHIBITIONS**

### A New Path to the Waterfall Open March 26 to June 29



The convergence of nature and technology inevitably ends in changes to both entities, eventually producing a hybrid of the two. John Bromberg and Samuelle Green's combined installation lays bare these two opposites, formulating a not-so-distant future tinged with apprehension.

Green's soft, yet rigid contours, and Bromberg's hardedge surfaces perfectly encapsulate the two disparate parts of the equation, the end result being the slow climb toward the inevitable explosion when the two finally meet. In the end, nature wins. This exhibition promises to be a thought- provoking artistic statement from two of Northeastern Pennsylvania's most visionary voices.

Herbert Simon: Painter...Sculptor...Printmaker...

A retrospective of the life's work of sculptor, printmaker, and painter Herbert Simon, this exhibition presents the wide breadth of the artist's prolific and diverse output in all facets of his artistic quest.

Having studied with leading figures of abstraction including Hans Hofmann, Robert Motherwell, and Phillip Guston in the mid-century, and highly inspired by the industrial landscape of Northeastern Pennsylvania and simple everyday objects later, Simon developed an approach encompassing both representationalism to pure abstraction to satisfy his vision.

# Universal Codes: Works by Daniel Martin Diaz on View Through April 27



Arizona-based artist Daniel Martin Diaz pulls from an eclectic mix of influences including fantastical Mexican

religious iconography, mystical votive offerings, the Early Netherlandish painters, Gothic ornamentation, arcane religious sigils and medallions, alchemy, and the symbolism of secret societies to create paintings. Much of his work examines the concepts of death and religion, as he seeks to pose questions but not answer them.
