A New Path to the Waterfall, a joint exhibition of work by Samuelle Green and John Bromberg, explores the convergence of nature and technology. Featuring Bromberg's large-scale *Bridge to Nowhere* sculpture meeting Green's immersive cavernous paper installations, this exhibition also serves as the last exhibition of Bromberg's eclectic art career.

These seasoned Northeastern Pennsylvania artists bring their personal talents and philosophical views to the universal question of the growing tension between the natural world and technology.
